

Wilmington Robotics Teams (MS & HS)

The Wilmington Robotics Teams did amazingly on Saturday, 1/13/2024 at our 2nd competition. Our teams finished 2, 4 and 5th out of 21 total teams. They played well, overcame challenges and had fun practicing STEM skills!

In addition to the 3 teams making it to the semi-finals, the HS team (Wired Wildcats) got the "Connect Award" and the MS team (Apollo) got the Control Award (see below). <u>Highlights of the competition:</u>

- 1. Challenges of weather, mechanical failures and software issues were overcome
- 2. Our teams were the top middle school teams in the competition, finishing 2nd and 4th in qualifying matches.
- 3. Both middle school teams made the semifinals for the second straight time and were able to invite the High School Robotics Team to compete cooperatively in the playoffs.
- 4. The middle school achieved the highest score of the day, with 163 points.
- 5. The middle school won the Control Award for innovative autonomous design features using sensors!

The Robotics Team's energy and perseverance truly reflected positively on the character of the

Grace LaMonica represented the town of Wilmington at the Project 351 Launch Day Event. Project 351 is a statewide, student lead, community service organization.

On Saturday, 1/13/2024, we kicked off a year of service by having ambassadors from all 351 towns and cities in MA join together to do a full day of community service in Boston.

Grace participated in Cradles to Crayons which directly impacted 2,500 lives with their service projects. Statewide, ambassadors impacted the lives of 27,194 lives statewide across three service sites.

With much laughter, dancing and gratitude, the Project 351 ambassadors positively impacted thousands of lives with our one day of service. Project 351 has positively impacted over 1 million lives since its inception.






LGBTQIA+ discussion group (in-person & virtual)

Peace At Home Parenting Solutions specializes in empowering parents with evidence-based strategies to foster nurturing connections that safeguard their children's mental well-being. The trainings are presented by experts with advanced degrees and the trainings focus on child and adolescent development, including difficulties in school, mental health challenges, neurodiversity, LGBTQ+ identity formation, racism, and grief. These trainings present easy-to-use strategies for long-lasting change.

DESE Tiered Focused Monitoring

During the week of February 5, 2024, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education's

Office of Public School Monitoring (PSM) will conduct a Tiered Focused Monitoring Review of the



Wilmington Public Schools.

The Office of Public School Monitoring visits each district and charter school every three years to monitor compliance with federal and state special education and civil rights regulations. Areas of review related to special education include student assessments, determination of eligibility, the Individualized

Education Program (IEP) Team process, and IEP development and implementation. Areas of review related to civil rights include bullying, student discipline, physical restraint, and equal access to school programs for all students. In addition to the onsite visit, parent outreach is an important part of the review process. The review chairperson from the Office of Public School Monitoring will send all parents of students with disabilities an online survey that focuses on key areas of their child's special education program. Survey results will contribute to the development of a report. During the onsite review, the Office of Public School Monitoring will interview a member of the district's Special Education Parent Advisory Council (SEPAC). Other onsite activities may include interviews of district staff and administrators, reviews of student records, and onsite observations.

Parents and other individuals may contact Jill Lange, Public School Monitoring Chairperson, at gillian.e.lange@mass.gov to request a telephone interview. If an individual requires accommodation, such as translation, to participate in an interview, the Department will make the necessary arrangements. Within approximately sixty (60) business days after the onsite visit, the review chairperson will provide the district with a report with information about areas in which the district meets or exceeds regulatory requirements and areas in which the district requires assistance to correct or improve practices.
